Course Objectives and Programme Outcomes

Overall Outcome of UG Programme in History:

- Students will get a basic idea of history and historiography. The concepts of time, historical periods, and chronology will give them the proper historical enlightenment.
- The study of history covers all aspects of human society. Political, social, economic, cultural, intellectual, and religious developments are all part of history. They can learn that History is a "**process of interaction between the historian and his facts, an unending dialogue between the present and the past**" (E.H. Carr).
- The ability to Critical thinking, creative writing and logical discussion will be developed among the students.
- The students will be updated to prepare for the Master's degree Program. They will also get some extra benefits in some competitive examinations of contemporary times because the history paper is very crucial in those exams.

Objectives and Outcomes

- **CC-1 : History of India from the earliest times to C 300 BCE:** Students will have a clear understanding of the reconstruction of the history of ancient India along with the Stone Ages. Students will have a clear understanding of the history of the Harappa Civilization and the Vedic Civilization. Students will learn about the history of the Sixteenth Mahajanapada and contemporary South India.

- **CC-2 : Social Formations and Cultural Patterns of the ancient world other than India:** Students will understand the history of different parts of the world outside of India from the Palaeolithic Age to the Bronze age. Along with this, the process of human evolution from food gatherer to food producer will be clear. Students will know the history of Ancient Egypt, Greece and Rome.

Objectives and Outcomes

- **CC-3 : History of India C 300 BCE to C 750 CE:** Students will be enlightened on the political structure and socio-economic conditions of the Maurya, Kushana and Satavahana periods. The students' knowledge will increase on the political structure, socio-economic conditions, religion, society and culture of early-medieval India.

- **CC-4 : Social Formations and Cultural patters of the Medieval World other than India:** Students will learn about the history of Europe from the fall of the Roman Empire. Students will learn about the Social and political history of medieval Europe, the Crusades and the Rise of the Feudalism.

Objectives and Outcomes

- **CC-5 : History of India (CE 750 – 1206):** Students will learn about the formation of political structure, Indian Feudalism, socio-economic conditions, local and long-distance trade, religion and culture of Early Medieval India.
- **CC-6 : Rise of the Modern West – I:** Students will learn about the expansion of feudalism in Europe, the feudalism debate, decline of the feudalism, the Renaissance, the Reformation, economic development and the development of the monarchy in Early Modern Europe.
- **CC-7 : HISTORY OF INDIA (c.1206-1526):** Students will know about the political structure, socio-economic status, religion and culture of the Delhi Sultanate.
- **SEC –A (1): Archives and museums:** Students will learn how to conserve the sources of history through museums and archives.

Objectives and Outcomes

- **CC-8 : Rise of the Modern West – II:** Students will learn about the cultural, political, and socio-economic history of seventeenth and eighteenth-century Europe.
- **CC-9 : History of India (c 1526 – 1605):** Students will learn about the political expansion and structure, socio-economic conditions, and religious conditions of the Mughal Empire from the beginning of this mighty Empire.
- **CC-10 : History of India (c 1605 – 1750s):** Students will learn the political, socio-economic, commercial, religious and cultural history of the Mughal Empire in the seventeenth and eighteenth centuries. They will also learn about the gradual disintegration of this mighty Empire
- **SEC –B (2): Art Appreciation: An Introduction to Indian Art:** Students will learn about the richness and diversity of India's art and heritage from prehistoric times to contemporary times. Students will also be aware of preserving the heritage of their own country.

Objectives and Outcomes

- **CC-11: History of Modern Europe (c.1780 – 1939):** Students will get the concepts of transformation of the Political, Ethnological and Socio-Economic History of Europe from the time of the French Revolution to the eve of the Second World War.
- **CC-12: History of India (c 1750s – 1857):** Students will learn the early history of colonial subjugation and early resistance against it in the Indian subcontinent.
- **DSE-A-1 : History of Bengal (c.1757-1905):** Students will learn the history politics, culture and socio-economic conditions in Colonial Bengal.
- **DSE-B-1 : History of Modern East Asia – I China (c.1840 – 1949):** Students will get the concepts of various aspects of the political, cultural and socio-economic history of Modern China.

Objectives and Outcomes

- **CC-13 : History of India (c. 1857 – 1964):** Students will learn the history of the emerging Nationalism of India. They will get the idea of the nature of British Imperialism, the history of anti-imperialism and many facets of the national movement against the colonial subjugation of India. The students will also learn about the initial challenges of postcolonial India.
- **CC-14 : History of World Politics: 1945-1994:** Students will get the concepts of International Relations in the History of the World in the Post-World-War-II Era.
- **DSE-A-3 : History of Bengal (c.1905-1947):** Students will learn the history politics, culture and socio-economic conditions in Colonial Bengal.
- **DSE-B-3 : History of Modern East Asia – II Japan (c.1868 – 1945):** Students will get the concepts of various aspects of the political, cultural and socio-economic history of Modern Japan.
